Of every person who is alive at midnight on the night of Sunday, 18th April, 1926, and who, whether as member of the family or as visitor, boarder or servant in the household or establishment:— (1) passes that night in the dwelling of the household or establishment, or (2) arrives and is received into the household or establishment on the morning of Monday, 19th April, 1926, not having already been enumerated elsewhere.
